Basic Requirements

Practicing

Studying a string instrument requires patience, diligence, and consistent daily practice. Parents need to provide a quiet place for their child to practice at the same time every day. It is extremely important to practice on class days as well as non-class days.

Grooming and Attire

Long nails and musical instruments do not mix! Please make sure that children have their nails trimmed short at all times. Also, long hair needs to be tied back so that it does not interfere with playing instruments.

Performance party attire: White shirts, with black pants or skirts. Please no jeans and no shorts or skirts above the knee.

Instruments

A string instrument will be loaned to your child at no cost when he or she has demonstrated that he or she is ready to take an instrument home. At that time, we will set up a parent meeting so that everyone is aware of the responsibilities associated with borrowing a string instrument. These instruments are valued between \$400 and \$800 and are extremely fragile. They must be taken care of and handled with extreme care. Contracts outlining responsibilities must be signed before students take instruments home.
